On Tuesday morning, we walked to RHS where we were treated to a fantastic production of <u>The Little Mermaid</u> put on by Riverview High School's drama group. We all enjoyed the show immensely!!

Math

Subtraction continues to be our focus in math. This week, we learned about the Neighbors on the Number Line strategy. For example, neighbors on the number line are 2 numbers beside each other when we count. When we subtract neighbors on the number line the answer is always 1. Ex. 6 – 5 = 1 or 10 – 9 = 1. Students completed a mid-way assessment on Subtraction this week. I am very pleased with the progress they are making! This assessment will come home in the next learning log.

This week, we launched our **Geometry Unit**. The students are focusing on learning about **3D objects** including **spheres**, **cylinders**, **cones**, **cubes**, **rectangular prisms**, and **square pyramids**. They are learning about each object's attributes and are brainstorming examples of each object in their school and home environment (ex. sphere = ball; rectangular prism = cereal box; etc.).

Literacy

This week in Word Work, we reviewed that /ed/ makes three different sounds at the end of a word: /d/ as in cleaned, /ed/ as in wanted and /t/ as in missed. Students read and sorted words to practice these three sounds. In Phonics, we continue to review the many sounds we have learned to date. Our Word Family of the Week was -eat. We made a list of words containing -eat and did many activities to reinforce meat, heat, and treat.

In **Reading**, we are reviewing various strategies such as **Stretchy Snake**, **Skippy Frog**, **Chunky Monkey** and **Cross Checking**. We are also continuing to practice **Dot the Giraffe**, which has us focusing on fluency, expression and punctuation. As well, we continue to **Make Mind Movies** as we read Book 9 of the Magic Tree House series, <u>Dolphins at Daybreak</u>.

In Writing, we continue to work on our Animal Research projects. This week, we focused on writing about our animal's Habitat. Students wrote a strong beginning or 'hook', a Mighty Middle, as well as an Ending for this section. The students are very engaged in this writing project and are eager to write about each section.
